Dear Parents/Guardians,

We hope you and your child/ward had a wonderful and meaningful mid-year school holiday, filled with joy and precious family moments together. As we step into Term 3, we are excited to share the programmes and activities we have planned for the term ahead. Your continued partnership and support are deeply valued, and we look forward to working closely with you as we continue to nurture your child's learning and growth.

1. Math Week

As part of our efforts to make the learning of Mathematics meaningful and engaging, we will be organising Math Week in Term 2 Week 2. This year's theme, "Unlock the Magic of (Spatial) Mathematical Thinking", focuses on helping students develop their ability to visualise, reason, communicate and solve problems through hands-on spatial tasks and puzzles.

Throughout the week, students will participate in a range of activities designed to strengthen spatial reasoning and mathematical communication. The programme will begin with a school assembly featuring student sharing and math performances, helping students see that Mathematics is not just about getting answers, but also about thinking, reasoning and expressing ideas.

During Mathematics lessons, students will engage in spatial learning activities using tangrams and pentominoes. Through these tasks, teachers will continue to use Math Talk Moves to encourage students to explain their thinking, build on one another's ideas, and make their thinking visible. Students will also have opportunities to apply their learning during recess activities such as the Math Café Tangram Challenge and Puzzle Game Booths. These activities are designed to promote collaboration, strategic thinking, communication and problem-solving in a fun and interactive environment.

We hope that Math Week 2026 will continue to nurture our students' curiosity, confidence, and joy in learning Mathematics, while helping them discover the magic of thinking and communicating mathematically.

2. Celebrating ME! – Health Week

Celebrating Me! is a school-wide initiative by the Physical Education (PE) Department and Peer Support and Relationships (PSR) Team to help students understand the importance of taking care of their bodies and minds. During recess in Term 3 Week 3, students will participate in a variety of fun and meaningful activities that promote healthy habits, self-care and mental well-being. These activities are engaging and age-appropriate, providing students with simple and practical ways to stay healthy—both physically and emotionally.

3. Mother Tongue Fortnight

To deepen students' appreciation of their Mother Tongue Languages (MTL) and cultural heritage, our school will be celebrating Mother Tongue Fortnight in Term 3 Week 5. Held in collaboration with Racial Harmony Day, ~~encourages~~ students will be encouraged to learn about traditions and cultural identity through meaningful hands-on arts and craft experiences. Through a range of engaging recess and classroom activities, students will have the opportunity to explore the richness of Chinese, Malay, and Tamil cultures while

strengthening their language skills in authentic and enjoyable ways. Activities include Batik Painting, Jawi Calligraphy, Rangoli/Kolam Drawing, Puppet, Blow Painting, and Seal Engraving. Students across all levels will also participate in interactive cultural experiences in the classroom such as Speech & Drama, Kite Decoration, Mask Painting, and Pot Painting.

We look forward to a vibrant and enriching Mother Tongue Fortnight celebration where students can create, express, and connect through language and culture.

4. Racial Harmony Day

This year's Racial Harmony Day theme is "Our People, Our Tapestry". Our various cultural threads, each representing the unique identities, traditions, beliefs, and practices of our diverse communities, are often intertwined with and complement one another. While we recognise that these intertwined threads may sometimes fray, whether from friction among communities or the pull of external forces, it is our responsibility to work together to mend or reinforce them. By always seeking to understand and being respectful of our ethnic and religious communities, we can ensure that our multicultural tapestry remains strong and unified, exemplifying the strength and beauty of our shared heritage and commitment to harmony.

The school will be commemorating Racial Harmony Day with an assembly programme and fringe activities on Tuesday, 21 July 2026. All students are encouraged to come dressed in their traditional costumes on that day with white school shoes and socks. If your child has PE lessons on that day, they may bring and change into their school uniform.

5. National Day Celebration

The school will be celebrating Singapore's 61st National Day on Friday, 7 August 2026. As part of our celebrations, we encourage all students to wear red National Day themed T-shirts with school shorts/skorts and school shoes and socks on that day.

School will be in session from 7.30am to 10.00am on Friday, 7 August 2026. Please ensure that your child has his/her breakfast before coming to school as there will not be any recess break that day. Students are to bring their stationery, water bottles, and a story book that day.

Our school bus vendors have been informed about the early dismissal. Students going home by school bus will be transported at 10.00am.

Our school-based SCC will be closed on Friday, 7 August 2026, due to its Staff Development Day.

Please note that Monday, 10 August 2026 is a Public Holiday.

6. PSLE Oral and Listening Comprehension Examinations 2026

The dates for the PSLE Oral and Listening Comprehension Examinations are as follows:

Oral Examinations : Wednesday, 12 August 2026 and Thursday, 13 August 2026

Listening Comprehension: Tuesday, 15 September 2026

P1 to P5 students need not attend school on these days. *Our School-Based Student Care Centre will be operating from 7am to 6pm on these days.* For P6 students who are taking the school bus, please make the necessary transport arrangements.

P6 students will receive further instructions for their PSLE Oral and Listening

Comprehension Examinations nearer to the date.

7. Kindfluence Project @ NAPS

As part of our school's Semester 2 Kindfluence Project in Term 3 Week 9 to 10, an extension of Kindness 2.0, our student leaders will be coming together to spread kindness and make a positive difference in the school and external community. This year, our student leaders or 'Kindfluencers' will continue to spread joy and gratitude in our Marine Terrace neighbourhood and within the school community. These activities serve to remind everyone that small acts of kindness can have a big impact and that when we work together, we can build a more caring and connected community in and around NAPS.

8. Teachers' Day Celebration

On Wednesday, 2 September 2026, school will function from 7.30am to 1.30pm. All after-school activities will be suspended as our teachers will be attending a Teachers' Day Reception in appreciation of their dedication and care for our students.

The school will celebrate Teachers' Day on Thursday, 3 September 2026, with school hours from 7.30 am to 10 am. As there will be no recess for all levels, please ensure your child has breakfast before coming to school. Students should bring their stationery, a water bottle and a storybook for the day.

The school has informed the school bus vendors and school-based Student Care Centre (SCC) about the early dismissal. Students taking the school bus will depart at 10am and *the school-based SCC will operate from 10am to 2pm on Thursday, 3 September 2026.*

Please note that Friday, 4 September 2026, is a school holiday in observance of Teachers' Day.

9. End-of-Year Written Examinations for P3 to P5 students

The End-of-Year written examinations for P3 to P5 students are tentatively scheduled from Thursday, 22 October 2026 to Wednesday, 28 October 2026. We will furnish you with more details nearer the dates. There is no End-of-Year Examination for P1 and P2 students.

10. School Examination Policy

Please take note of the following school examination policy:

- Students must sit for each paper strictly according to the date and time stipulated in the examination timetable.
- There will be no make-up papers for students who are absent on examination days.
- Students who are ill or are covered by medical certificates* (MC) on the day of the paper are not allowed to sit for it.
- Students who are on medical leave are required to produce their MC immediately upon their return to school. Their marks will be computed accordingly. No marks will be awarded for the paper if there are no supporting MC.

* Parents who wish for their child to take the papers during the period covered by MC must produce doctor's memo to certify that the child is fit for school.

11. Punctuality & School Attendance

The school day starts at 7.30am daily with flag raising, singing of National Anthem and pledge taking. Students are required to report to school and be present at the Basketball Court (P1 & P2) or the Hall (P3 to P6) or they will be considered late. We seek your kind

understanding and cooperation to ensure that your child arrives on time as it is vital that your child/ward establishes good routines and habits from young. If your child is absent from school, kindly inform the school through Parents Gateway (navigate to the 'Services' tab at the bottom and select 'Student Absence'). Please also attach any relevant supporting documents, such as a medical certificate.

12. School Traffic Reminders

To ensure the safety of our students and to maintain smooth traffic flow around the school, parents and guardians who drive are kindly reminded to:

- Observe the 30 km/h speed limit within the Marine Terrace Silver Zone outside school.
- Avoid making U-turns in front of the school gates.
- During school dismissal, please do not wait outside the school's front gate or along Marine Terrace Road. Use the nearby car parks instead.
- For pick-up in the afternoons from after-school activities (e.g., remedial lessons, CCAs, enrichment programmes) or when picking up your child from the SCC in the afternoon, please do not wait or park along the school driveway or porch. If you are waiting for your child to walk out, kindly cooperate with the security guards and park only in designated car park lots as directed.

If your child/ward commutes to and from school by bicycle or scooter, please complete the registration form via this [link](#) and remind your child/ward to enter and exit via the side gate at Gate 3. Kindly remind your child/ward that cycling and scootering are not permitted within the school compound. Students must dismount and walk their bicycles or scooters once they are on school grounds.

Your cooperation is essential in ensuring a safe and orderly environment for all.

13. Renovation of School Toilets

As part of our ongoing efforts to improve and maintain a clean and comfortable environment for all our students, the school will carry out phased renovation works on Block A, B, C and D toilets from 29 May to 31 December 2026.

During this period, students will be directed to alternative toilet facilities if the nearest one is unavailable. Rest assured that proper supervision and safety measures will be in place to minimise any disruption to the school day.

Your patience and understanding will be appreciated, and we look forward to providing our students with improved facilities upon completion of the work.

Even though there are no remedial lessons this week, curriculum lessons (e.g. Higher Mother Tongue, Mother Tongue, Foundation English lessons, Foundation Mathematics) for selected students will still be held on Tuesday or Friday afternoon, as indicated in the class timetable.

School Policy on Assessment Matters

In support of the learning and development of your child/ward, the school is committed to assessing our students holistically. To this end, we have put in place a range of varied and progressive modes of assessment. We would like to bring to the attention of parents, guardians and students the following examination policies and assessment practices.

1. Absence from Weighted Assessments or Examinations

There will be no make-up assessments for students who are absent for any Weighted Assessment. The overall marks for absentees will be calculated based solely on the assessments completed during the year.

Absence Due to Illness

Students who are unwell on the day of a Weighted Assessment will not be permitted to sit for it. In the interest of students' health and safety, we strongly urge parents and guardians not to send their children/wards to school to sit for any assessment while they remain on Medical Leave.

Upon returning to school, students who were absent due to illness are required to submit a valid Medical Certificate (MC) issued by a registered medical doctor. Letters from parents or guardians will not be accepted, as the school requires official medical documentation in order to uphold fairness and consistency for all students.

In support of students' continued learning, absentees will be permitted to complete the relevant papers upon their recovery and are required to submit the completed papers to their respective subject teachers for marking. Please note, however, that the marks obtained will not be factored into the overall mark computation.

Absence Due to Valid Reasons

Students participating in the school-initiated activities, e.g. National School Games (NSG), or school-approved external activities, e.g. external piano examinations, will be facilitated to complete their Weighted Assessment either before or after their scheduled activity on the day of the assessment, where time permits.

Where this is not possible, their overall marks will be pro-rated accordingly, and students will be provided with the Weighted Assessment paper for practice purposes. Subject teachers will furnish the necessary feedback thereafter.

2. Misconduct and Dishonesty

Cheating, attempting to cheat, assisting in cheating, misbehaving, or not following assessment regulations are serious offences. Disciplinary action will be taken against any student found to have breached these rules.
